ISSS MODIFIED OPERATIONS

Please note the following operational modifications will take effect Monday, May 13, 2024, through Friday, August 2, 2024:

I-20/DS-2019 EXPIRING IN MAY

If your I-20 or DS-2019 document expires on May 31 and if you are *not* completing your academic program by May 31, please review our Extension of Program page for information and instructions on how to request an extension. Please note that your request must be submitted at least two weeks prior to the end date listed on your I-20/DS-2019, as our office must have time to extend your end date before May 31.

If you are graduating this May, congratulations! Please be sure to review our <u>Graduating Students</u> page for information on your options following your F-1 degree program.

APPLYING FOR CPT & OPT

All students applying for Curricular Practical Training (CPT) or OPT must complete the Off-Campus Employment Workshop on the RGlobal portal (under Workshops on the left-hand menu). F-1 students who plan to engage in CPT during the summer break should plan to submit a CPT application as soon as possible. F-1 students graduating in May planning to apply for post-completion OPT should submit an OPT application as soon as possible.

Please note that summer CPT must begin after the end of the spring semester, and summer CPT must end before the start of the fall semester. Please refer to the Academic Calendar for details.

CPT Application and OPT I-20 requests will be processed within approximately 7 business days after the successful and complete submission of an application.

As F-1/J-1 students, it is your responsibility to know the rules and laws governing your legal status, including the regulations regarding off-campus internships or any off-campus employment. You do not need to wait until you have a job interview to find out what those rules are. For questions about CPT and OPT, please refer to our <u>Practical Training</u> page.

SUMMER TRAVEL

As the spring semester ends, we understand some of you may be considering domestic or international travel. As always, we would like to advise all our students to exercise caution and review the <u>Travel and Visa Information webpage</u> for further detailed international travel guidance, resources, and tips. The travel signature on the I-20 or DS-2019 is valid for 12 months (6 months for students on OPT) and confirms that the student is in valid legal status and eligible to return to the United States to resume their programs. Students graduating in May 2024 should also be aware that you must be physically present in the U.S. to apply for work authorization after graduation, called <u>Optional Practical Training</u>. If you are not in the U.S. at the time of submitting your application, you cannot apply for OPT.
