SPRING BREAK TRAVEL ADVISORY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

With spring break on the horizon, we understand some of you may be considering either domestic or international travel. As always, we would like to advise all our students to be careful and alert during any travel – domestic and international – and be prepared to face extra scrutiny at visa issuing posts and at ports of entry. As always, follow all rules and regulations to <u>maintain your legal status in the U.S</u>. Visit the ISSS <u>Travel and Visa Information</u> page for information and detailed recommendations for travel.

In light of the COVID pandemic, it is essential to remain aware of current travel restrictions - not only in the U.S. but also in the country to which you are traveling. Matters can be complicated further if you must apply for a new F-1 visa stamp during your travel; consulates may be offering limited services or could close. If this happens, you may not be able to return to the U.S. for an undetermined amount of time.

Students graduating in May 2022 should also be aware that you must be physically present in the U.S. in order to apply for work authorization after graduation, called <u>Optional Practical Training</u>. If you are not in the U.S. at the time of submitting your application, you cannot apply for OPT.

TRAVEL INSTRUCTIONS FOR F-1 AND J-1 STUDENTS WHO PLAN TO TRAVEL

All F-1 and J-1 students (and their F-2 and J-2 dependents) should obtain a travel signature from ISSS on their I-20 or DS-2019 form. The signature is valid for 12 months (6 months for students on OPT) and confirms that the I-20 or DS-2019 owner is in valid legal status and eligible to return to the U.S. to resume their programs. If you decide to travel internationally, please follow the instructions on the ISSS website for details of the Travel Signature Request Procedure.

Remember, you need a valid travel signature when you return to the U.S., not when you are leaving. In case you are outside the U.S. and need a travel signature before you re-enter, please follow the instructions on the ISSS website to request a signature on your document.

Traveling outside the U.S.

When traveling outside the United States, F-1 and J-1 visa holders must have in their possession the following documentation to ensure their ability to re-enter the U.S. and resume their activities:

- Passport valid at least six months beyond re-entry date
- Valid U.S. visa in the appropriate classification, e.g., F-1, J-1
- Valid immigration document for the status being sought: I-20 or DS-2019 with travel signature from Rutgers Global ISSS. The travel signature is valid for 12 months.

Please check the validity dates of your I-20/DS-2019. If you are on Rutgers' visa sponsorship and you need an extension of your I-20 or DS-2019, please follow instructions on our website for an <u>Extension of Program</u>.

APPLYING FOR CPT

All students applying for Curricular Practical Training (CPT) must complete the Off-Campus Employment Workshop on <u>Canvas</u>. F-1 students who plan to engage in CPT during the summer break should plan to submit a <u>CPT application</u> as soon as possible.

APPLYING FOR OPT

While the USCIS deadline for post-completion OPT applications is 60 days following degree completion, it can take 4-5 months for USCIS to process the applications. All students applying for post-completion OPT must complete the Post-Completion OPT Workshop on Canvas. F-1

students who will be graduating in May and who plan to apply for post-completion OPT should plan to submit an OPT application as soon as possible.

Online OPT Application Alert: Do not submit an OPT application online from outside of the U.S. and/or without a **SIGNED OPT recommendation I-20**. Once you pay the online application fee, the I-765 is considered filed immediately and will result in a denial if you applied from outside the U.S. or without the OPT I-20.

If you have questions about your OPT application, we encourage you to utilize the following resources:

- Off-Campus Employment Chat Sessions: Available twice a month and open for students to drop in and discuss their CPT/OPT questions with an International Student Adviser (ISA)
- Remote Advising Appointments: Note that appointment availability is displayed up to 7
 days in advance and no less than 12 hours from the time of booking. If you do not see
 any available appointments, please check again on the following day for new availability.
