Opening a US bank account

As a J-1 exchange visitor/ international scholar, you will be able to open a US bank account after you arrive. When opening a bank account, please make sure you have your passport and DS-2019 with you.

Credit cards

In the United States, the use of credit cards is very common (more so than apps such as Apple Pay). It is a good idea to have a credit card (Visa, Mastercard) from your bank in your home country when you arrive here in the United States.

Cost of living

In New Jersey, costs of living expenses are high, which is reflected in high rent prices, high car insurance rates, and high prices in general. Please make sure you inform yourself about this before your departure.

Taxes

Social Security

International scholars should wait **10 days** after their online check-in with Rutgers Global in the SEVIS system before applying for the Social Security Number (SSN). This timeline ensures that their information has been received by the other agency.

After 10 days, international scholars can request a SSN at: https://www.ssa.gov/number-card/request-number-first-time. They will then select a date for a follow-up appointment at the nearest Social Security Office at: https://www.ssa.gov/locator/.

The following documents are required for the SSN interview:

- Passport and visa
- Original form DS-2019 or I-797
- I-94 arrival record printed from <u>www.cbp.gov/i94</u>

Note: Your name on your I-94 printout must be spelled exactly as it is spelled in your passport



HEALTHCARE

Health Insurance

Based on the J-1 program regulations of the U.S. Department of State, all J-1 exchange visitors (and their dependents) must have health insurance for their entire J-1 program. https://global.rutgers.edu/international-scholars-students/health-insurance

In the J-1 application process, your department may have arranged health insurance coverage for you on a Visiting Scholar Plan. If this is the case, please see the following about how health insurance will start:

- To activate your health insurance, you must first complete the online check-in with our
 office upon your arrival. Please email our office for the online check-in instructions (<u>isss-facultyscholars@global.rutgers.edu</u>)
- Once you have checked in, your program will be validated and your health insurance coverage will begin.
- You will receive an email from our insurance specialist with important information from your health insurance provider.
- Please make sure that you read everything carefully and follow the necessary steps as described.

Please note: If you are employed by Rutgers, you will receive additional information about Health Insurance and State Health Benefits Program (SHBP) when you attend the New Employee Orientation. The Visiting Scholar Plan will cover you for your first two months of employment only. Therefore, you MUST enroll yourself and any J-2 dependents in the State Health Benefits Program (SHBP) by the deadline communicated during the New Employee Orientation.



Helpful Explanations Regarding the US Health Care System

The US healthcare system is more complicated than healthcare systems in other countries, so it may take you some time to understand everything. Some things to keep in mind include:

- In-Network vs. Out-of-Network Providers Most health plans provide access to a
 specific network of doctors and facilities that agree to accept a discounted rate. These
 healthcare providers are considered "in-network." If a doctor or facility has no contract
 with your health plan, they're considered out-of-network and can charge you full price. It's
 usually much higher than the in-network discounted rate.
- **Co-Payment** You are usually required to pay the doctor or service provider each time you use their health care services. This is sometimes called a co-payment.
- Deductible After receiving care, doctors send bills to your health insurance company.
 The health insurance company will pay some or all of these bills, and you are required to pay the balance of what is not covered by health insurance. Each health insurance plan will specify a deductible, which is the amount that you must pay before the insurance plan starts to pay.
- Premium Some J-1 exchange visitors will receive health insurance through the State
 Health Benefits Program (SHBP) as a benefit of being a Rutgers employee. Rutgers may
 only pay part of the cost and deduct the remaining monthly cost from your pay. This
 monthly cost is called a "premium."

Once you are enrolled in a health insurance plan, please be sure to review what your health insurance plan covers, and which providers are considered in-network.

If you need immediate medical care, you can go to the emergency room of the nearest hospital to receive treatment.
