## Assessments

Most students will be able to take any end of semester exams early and complete all assessment by **23 April 2027** (some coursework may be submitted after this date). Some institutions require students to sit assessment with City St George's students, and assessment for these students will be between **10 May – 4 June 2027**. Please check with your home institution or the [City St George's Study Abroad Office](#) if you are unsure what assessment period you will be required to take. Transcripts for students studying in Spring 2027 will be available from mid-July 2027.

## Modules

Most modules on the Study Abroad Programme are worth 15 credits. This is the equivalent of 7.5 ECTS, and we recommend that it should transfer as 4 US credits. Your home university is ultimately responsible for transferring your credit, and you should check with your home institution what credit they will award for study at City St George's.

A full load of modules is four, worth 60 credits.

## Adding and Dropping modules

It is possible to add/drop your registered modules up until the end of orientation (29 January). Changes in the first week of teaching up (until noon on 5 February) can only be made if there is a timetable clash.

You should make sure you have spoken to your academic and study abroad advisers at your home institution about any academic requirements you have before applying and selecting your modules.

## Timetables

Personalised timetables will be available in January. From October outline timetables will be available for you to check whether your chosen modules will complement each other.

## General pre-requisites

Most degrees at City St George's are three years long. The module code tells you what level of experience degree students taking that module will have.

Level 1000 modules are introductory level, degree students taking these in Spring 2027 will be in their first year at university. Study Abroad students should not take more than one or two modules at this level.

Level 2000 modules are taken by students with a background in the subject area, for example one or two successfully passed university level courses in the subject area or with transferable skills.

Level 3000 modules are taken by students who have extensive knowledge of the subject area. Degree students will be the equivalent of a US major in the subject and will be graduating at the end of the semester.

We recommend that students taking a full load of modules at City St George's should take modules mostly in Level 2 and Level 3. Level 1 modules should only be taken if the subject area is new to you.

Our UK and British Culture modules are designed to be taken by students with a variety of academic backgrounds, and we recommend that students only take two of these.
