#### **A NOTE FROM ISSS**

Thanksgiving will be celebrated in the U.S. on Thursday, November 28. This is the time of year for giving thanks, and the staff of ISSS are certainly thankful that we get to work with all of you! Please note that University offices will be closed on November 28 and 29 for the holiday.

As we approach the final months of the semester, know that we are here to help and support you. Please remember to plan ahead and let us know if you have questions about upcoming travel, Spring 2025 course registration, plans after graduation, and more. Additionally, we would like to personally remind you to beware of email and phone scams, as many students have reported these to us recently.

#### **OBTAIN A TRAVEL SIGNATURE BEFORE INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL**

If you are planning to travel internationally during the upcoming holidays, please exercise caution and review the <u>Travel and Visa Information webpage</u> for travel guidance, resources, and tips. The travel signature on the I-20 or DS-2019 is valid for 12 months (6 months for students on OPT) and confirms that the student is in valid legal status and eligible to return to the United States to resume their program. If you already have a valid travel signature, you do not need a new signature at this time.

If you need a new travel signature, visit the <u>Travel Signature Request Procedure</u> page on our website, and submit a <u>Travel Signature Request E-Form</u> via the RGlobal Portal. Once submitted, your document will be ready within 5 business days, and we will email you an I-20 or DS-2019 that has been digitally signed for travel.

# **TRAVEL CONSIDERATIONS**

Please note that domestic and international travel guidelines and policies are subject to change. We would like to advise all our students to be careful and alert during any travel. As always, follow all rules and regulations to maintain your legal status in the U.S. Visit the <u>Travel and Visa</u> <u>Information page</u> on the Rutgers Global website for information and detailed recommendations for travel.

# **Travel Reminders**

- Please plan well in advance if you need to apply for or renew your visa during your travel abroad. For more information, review the <u>visa application information</u> on the Rutgers Global website.
- Students living on campus should follow all instructions from Rutgers <u>Residence Life</u> regarding Winter Break.
- When making travel plans for winter recess, please be reminded that all international students are expected to return to the U.S. and resume in-person classes at the start of the Spring semester. The first day of Spring 2025 will be January 21, 2025.

# FULL COURSE OF STUDY REQUIREMENT

ISSS would like to remind all F-1 and J-1 students that there are restrictions and limitations for enrolling in online courses. Undergraduate students may count no more than 3 credits of online coursework toward the 12-credit full-time coursework requirement, and graduate students may count no more than 3 credits of online coursework toward the 9-credit full-time coursework requirement. Hybrid courses with a face-to-face component count as in-person classes. For more information, please refer to the <u>Full Course of Study Requirement</u> page.

#### **EMPLOYMENT WORKSHOPS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS**

ISSS hosts in-person CPT/OPT 101 workshops each semester for students to learn about the CPT and OPT process, eligibility, which forms to fill out with RGlobal, procedures, important dates, and filing your OPT application with USCIS. #### **INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS: BEWARE OF SCAMS**

ISSS has recently received a number of reports from international students this semester regarding scams. While you are at Rutgers, please take steps to protect yourself from scams

targeting unsuspecting international students. These scams, often originating as communication that *appears* as if it is from a government agency, can be very sophisticated. Remember: the IRS will not contact anyone about tax issues by phone (and local police will never contact anyone about tax issues). No government agency will ever call someone to ask for a form of payment over the phone. Additionally, be extremely cautious when authorizing bank transfers or wiring funds as these can be difficult to reverse, even if you are the victim of a scam. Please exercise caution and refer to the ISSS website for resources and tips to <u>protect</u> yourself from scams and fraud.

A recent scam reported involves an email from an individual claiming to offer a job opportunity at Rutgers. The email will appear to come from a Rutgers office, faculty, or staff member, and it will ask for the student to provide their personal information to receive payment. When in doubt about the legitimacy of a Rutgers email, or when suspecting a potential scam, please consult with <u>ISSS</u>. ISSS can help you determine if the situation is a scam and alert the international student and scholar community about the scam.

#### **SHOPPING SHUTTLE**

The Shopping Shuttle is a free service for international students and scholars, and it is scheduled on many Thursday evenings and Saturday mornings throughout the semester.
